Opera San José opens its 30th Anniversary Season with Verdi's amusing masterpiece Falstaff

What: Opera San José opens its 30th Anniversary Season with Giuseppe Verdi's *Falstaff*. Loosely

based on Shakespeare's comedy *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, *Falstaff* is a whimsical tale of greed and deception as an old portly knight tries to recapture his youth by attempting to entice two wealthy married women, who in turn trick and humiliate him for his deceitful lewdness. *Falstaff* will be sung in Italian with English supertitles. Eight performances are scheduled from September 7 through 22 at the California Theatre, 345 South First Street in downtown San José.
