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Opera San José presents Mozart's Powerful Musical Masterpiece

Don Giovanni

SAN JOSE, CA – **Opera San José** (OSJ) concludes its 30th Anniversary Season with Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's **Don Giovanni**. An arrogant nobleman seduces every woman he meets until he encounters something he cannot kill, beat up, dodge, or outwit. Mozart's dramatic genius pervades in **Don Giovanni** as he weaves humor, melodrama and supernatural elements into a powerful musical masterpiece. **Don Giovanni** will be sung in Italian with English supertitles. Eight performances are scheduled from April 19 through May 4 at the California Theatre, 345 South First Street in downtown San José. Tickets are on sale at the Opera San José Box Office, online at operasj.org or by phone at (408) 437-4450. The production of **Don Giovanni** is made possible, in part by a Cultural Affairs Grant from the City of San José and the Packard Humanities Institute.

Don Giovanni, with libretto by Lorenzo Da Ponte, is a story about a libertine who lives and loves according to his own desires until he pays the ultimate price. Based on the legends of Don Juan, **Don Giovanni** blends stark human tragedy and touching comedy, set to Mozart's limitless musical genius.

George Cleve, acclaimed music director of the Midsummer Mozart Festival, will conduct *Don Giovanni*. Maestro Cleve has become almost synonymous with Mozart as one of the world's most devoted interpreters of the composer's music. In 1974 he founded the Midsummer Mozart Festival, the only music festival in North America dedicated exclusively to Mozart. Cleve recently conducted the company's production of *Idomeneo*. As a guest conductor he has appeared with most of the major American and European orchestras, and has conducted many operas including *Don Carlos*, *Carmen*,

Anthony Quartuccio will conduct the April 26 and 27 performances. Quartuccio has conducted or

assisted in more than 20 operas for OSJ including the premiere of Mozart's *Idomeneo* and the 2012-13

production of Suor Angelica and Gianni Schicchi. Quartuccio is the music director for the South Valley

Symphony and the assistant conductor for the San José Chamber Orchestra.

German stage director **Daniel Witzke** makes his company debut with OSJ, serving as stage director for

Don Giovanni. Witzke works extensively in both opera and musical theatre in Europe and the United

States. He was originally trained as a professional singer and actor in Vienna, Berlin and Hamburg

pursuing a career onstage. As Staff Director at the Wiener Staatsoper he was responsible for directing,

reviving and assisting on more than twenty productions including Nabucco, Tristan und Isolde, Tosca,

Turandot, Aida and Die Fledermaus.

Don Giovanni features current members of OSJ's resident ensemble in the principal roles as well as

quest artists. Alternating in the role of Donna Anna are resident sopranos Cecilia Violetta López and

Jennifer Forni. They previously shared the role of Cio-Cio-san (Madama Butterfly). López is in her

second season in the resident ensemble and has appeared as Nannetta (Falstaff), Suor Angelica,

Leonora (Il trovatore), Rosalinde (Die Fledermaus) and Léïla (The Pearl Fishers). Forni made her debut

with OSJ in the role of Alice Ford (Falstaff). Recent engagements for Forni include her Metropolitan

Opera debut as the First Esquire (Parsifal) and Micaëla (Carmen) for Santa Fe Opera.

Resident mezzo-sopranos Nicole Birkland and Lisa Chavez alternate in the role of Donna Elvira and

recently shared the role of Suzuki (Madama Butterfly). Birkland made her company debut last season

and has appeared as Gertrud (Hansel and Gretel), Dame Quickly (Falstaff), Prince Orlofsky (Die

Fledermaus), Azucena (Il trovatore), Principessa (Suor Angelica) and Zita (Gianni Schicchi). Chavez made

her debut as Meg Page in Falstaff, and performed the role of Hansel in the company's production of

Hansel and Gretel. Other roles performed by Chavez include Dinah (Trouble in Tahiti), Geraldine (A

Hand of Bridge), and Lorca (Ainadamar) with Opera Parallèle of San Francisco.

Resident baritones **Zachary Altman** and **Evan Brummel** share the role of Don Giovanni. **Altman** made his company debut as Zurga in OSJ's 2012 production of *The Pearl Fishers* and has appeared as Dr. Falke (*Die Fledermaus*), Count di Luna (*Il trovatore*), Gianni Schicchi (*Gianni Schicchi*) and Ford (*Falstaff*). **Brummel** returns for a third year as a member of the resident ensemble after appearing in the roles of Sharpless (*Madama Butterfly*), Peter (*Hansel and Gretel*), Ford (*Falstaff*), Gianni Schicchi (*Gianni Schicchi*), Count di Luna (*Il trovatore*), and Zurga (*The Pearl Fishers*).

The role of Don Ottavio will be shared by resident tenors **James Callon** and **Marc Schreiner**. **Callon** is in his second year in the resident ensemble. Previous credits with OSJ include the roles of B.F. Pinkerton (*Madama Butterfly*), the Witch (*Hansel and Gretel*), Fenton (Falstaff), Nadir (*The Pearl Fishers*), Eisenstein (*Die Fledermaus*), Manrico (*Il trovatore*), and Rinuccio (*Gianni Schicchi*). Roles performed for **Schreiner** for OSJ include the Witch (*Hansel and Gretel*) and Fenton (Falstaff).

Rounding out the cast are former resident baritone **Karassen Karagiozov** and guest artist **Eugene Brancoveanu** who share the role of Leporello. Mezzo-sopranos **Kindra Scharich** and **Tania Mandzy Inala** share the role of Zerlina. Alternating in the role of Masetto are baritones **Daniel Scofield** and **Brian James Myer.** Former resident bass **Silas Elash** sings the role of Commendatore.

Opera San José's production of *Don Giovanni* includes set designs by **Annie Smart,** lighting design by **Jennifer Tipton**, costume designs by **Howard Tsvi Kaplan**, choregraphy by **Lise Ia Cour**, and wig and makeup designs by **Jeanna Parham**.
