

Cesare Sterbini

Italian librettist Cesare Sterbini (1784-1831) is best known today for his collaboration with Rossini on II barbiere di Siviglia.

Sterbini was born in Rome. In addition to his work as a librettist, he was a poet and an official of the Vatican treasury, and was fluent in Greek, Latin, French and German. He wrote his first libretto, Paolo e Virgini, in 1812 for Vincenzo Migliorucci.

Sterbini first worked with Rossini on Torvaldo e Dorlliska in 1815, replacing Jacopo Ferretti. He followed this with II barbiere di Siviglia in 1816, adapted from Beaumarchais' play, which became Sterbini's greatest and most lasting achievement.
