Opera San José Announces Popular 34th Season Line-Up

Company's 2017-18 Season to Include La rondine in Honor of its 100th Anniversary

SAN JOSE, CA (February 6, 2017) – Opera San José today announced the company's 2017-18 season opening September 19, 2017 with Mozart's *Così fan tutte*, conducted by Peter Grunberg and directed by Brad Dalton, followed by Puccini's *La rondine*, conducted by Christopher Larkin and directed by Candace Evans. The company will begin 2018 with Wagner's *The Flying Dutchman* on February 10, directed by Brad Dalton, and conclude the season in April with Verdi's *La traviata* directed by Shawna Lucey, both conducted by Opera San José music director Joseph Marcheso.

"Opera San José is bringing four time-honored masterpieces to the California Theatre this coming season, by the opera giants: Mozart, Puccini, Wagner, and Verdi. These are works that we have not produced in many years, and having assembled casts that are perfect for these roles, we believe audiences will find that each will engage the mind and refresh the senses. Each of these operas was conceived to be beautiful, and each one is beautiful. It seemed especially fitting to bring *La rondine* to the stage, as this is the 100th anniversary season of its Monte Carlo premiere," announced General Director Larry Hancock.

The 2017-18 season will feature principal artists from Opera San José's resident company and guest artists from across and United States and Europe. All performances will be held at the California Theatre, 345 South First Street in downtown San José. Subscriptions and tickets are available by phone (408) 437-4450, online www.operasj.org, and at the Opera San José Box Office, 2149 Paragon Dr., San José, CA 95131.

Single tickets will go on sale July 24, 2017, priced from \$56.00 to \$176.00. As always, students 25 and younger (with current student ID) can purchase tickets for \$10. Performances are supported, in part, by a grant from the San José Office of Cultural Affairs.

Thinking himself worldly and experienced, Don Alfonso decides to relieve his young friends, Ferrando and Gugliemo, of their faith in romantic love. He challenges them to a bet, promising that within 24 hours their fiancées will prove unfaithful. They accept, but find the challenge too painfully revealing and difficult



to withstand. Dressed in clown's clothes, these young men break their own hearts and the hearts of their fiancées. A comedy that is a tragedy underneath is the perfect stuff for the uncanny genius of Mozart, so clearly revealed in this dazzling score.

La rondine

At a fashionable Parisian party, a poet speaks of the nature of love, and Magda realizes that her life as a courtesan has no love at all. Seeking to relive her poor but unhappy youth, she dresses as a shop girl and ventures to the dance she frequented as a teenager. There, she meets and falls in love with a young man, and leaves her rich protector. Of course, it goes the way of all flesh. Puccini, at the height of his Romantic style, revels in the gaiety of Paris and the sensual richness of love: pure soaring lusciousness, and a little heartbreak.

The Flying Dutchman February 10 – 25, 2018

In his youth, Wagner created his fastest moving and perhaps his most effective score. *The Flying Dutchman* is an ideal introduction to Wagner. It's the easiest to listen to and it has real melodies that convey the ancient legend of the immortal Dutchman, which culminates with this opera. As the legend goes, a ship's captain is cursed to live until he can find someone who will love him until death. On this unique day he meets Senta, who has been obsessed with his legend from childhood. However, in the legend, she must die to free him from eternal life on earth, which has become a living hell. It is a brilliant story with one of the most compelling roles in all of opera, and it's Wagner!

La traviata

One of the most treasured operas of all time, *La traviata* is told in waltz time, giving us the life of the most beautiful woman in Paris. Dancing away her days, Violetta survives on the generosity of the wealthiest



men of France, living in luxury until she meets Alfredo Germont, who, having nothing, offers her love instead. For a short spring, she and Alfredo live an idyllic life in the country until his father convinces her that their relationship is harming Alfredo's sister. She gives him up and returns to a man who has kept her in the past, and everything crashes down around her. Verdi created one of the world's most successful works for the stage when he penned the perennial *La traviata*.
